## TOWNSHIP OF HILLSIDE ORDINANCE 0-25-09

## ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 186. LANDSCAPING, SECTION 3: REQUIREMENTS; ANNUAL FEE

WHEREAS, the title of Chapter 186 should be amended to include tree removal contractors; and

WHEREAS, the required annual fee for each commercial landscaper should be increased.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HILLSIDE THAT:

1. Chapter 186 – Landscaping, Section 3: Requirements; annual fee shall be amended as follows:

Chapter 186. Landscaping and Tree Removal Contractors

### § 186-3 Requirements; annual fee.

Every commercial landscaper operating within the Township of Hillside shall be required to comply with the following:

- **A.** The name, address and telephone number of the commercial landscaper shall be clearly indicated on both sides of any vehicle used in said operation and shall be no less than three inches in height.
- **B.** An annual fee of \$50 \$100.00 shall be paid to the Township by each commercial landscaper. Any fraction of a year will be considered a full year for the purpose of this section. The annual fee shall entitle the applicant to two tags. Additional tags shall be issued to duly registered commercial landscapers for a fee of \$10 \$15.00 per vehicle.
- C. Tags identifying that vehicles have been properly registered, must be displayed on the driver's side of each vehicle, next to or directly below the name indicated on said vehicle.
- **D.** Registration shall be renewed no later than February 28 of each year.
- **E.** Initial registration must be made prior to a commercial landscaper commencing operations within the Township.
- **F.** Disposal of all vegetative waste, including weeds, branches, clippings, leaves, debris, grass or other items of yard waste, must comply with all provisions of Chapter **261** of the Township Code governing the disposal of solid waste.

### 2. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstances, shall be held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance to the extent it can be given effect, or the application of such provision to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby, and to this extent the provisions of this Ordinance are severable.

### 3. REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with any provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to the extent of such inconsistencies.

### 4. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall become effective twenty (20) days following the final adoption thereof by the Township Council of the Township of Hillside and shall be published as required by law.

### TOWNSHIP OF HILLSIDE ORDINANCE 0-25-10

### AN ORDINANCE REGARDING PUBLIC ACCESS TO AND VIDEO AND AUDIO RECORDING ON MUNICIPALITY PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the Township of Hillside recognizes that rules and guidelines for individuals who wish to enter and record video and/or audio activities on government-owned property need to be established.

1. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Hillside as follows:

### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HILLSIDE that:

### **Section 1: PURPOSE**

The Township of Hillside Council (the "Council") of the Township of Hillside (the "Municipality") is committed to protecting the rights of citizens under the First Amendment of the United States Constitution, while implementing policies and procedures that protect the health, safety, welfare, and personal privacy of the Municipality's employees and the general public who do business with or use the services of the Municipality. This policy (this "Policy") is intended to delineate those portions of the Municipality Property (as defined herein) that are accessible to and observable by the general public from those portions that are accessible on a limited basis, establish rules of conduct that are applicable to all Municipality Property, and specify procedures for Municipality employees who encounter those who wish to access Municipality Property for observational purposes.

### **Section 2: DEFINITIONS**

"Limited Access Area" means any designated area on Municipality Property that is not generally open to or occupied by the public on only a limited, as-needed, or by-invitation basis; or is in an area generally open to or occupied by the public in close proximity to where private third parties conduct business with Municipality employees. Limited Access Areas may be designated by doors, physical barriers, building design features, signage, reception desks or stations, stanchions, ropes, fencing, bollards, or other visible indications. The lack of visible indications shall not prevent the Municipality from considering or treating an area as a Limited Access Area. The Municipality shall retain the right to verbally instruct third parties that an area is a Limited Access Area. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, Limited Access Areas include but are not limited to the following:

- a) Employee offices.
- b) Employee workspaces including copy rooms, mailrooms, and break areas.
- c) Employee parking lots, storage areas, access points, or other outside areas marked for use by Municipality employees or vehicles only.
- d) Areas in close proximity to places, stations, desks, counters, or teller windows at which private third parties conduct business with Municipality employees.
- e) Hallways, staircases, restrooms, elevators, and other areas by purpose or function restricted to limited or transitory occupancy or providing access solely to other Limited Access Areas.
- f) Maintenance, storage, and warehousing facilities.
- g) Public works and public safety buildings, except for any designated waiting or reception areas therein.

h) Water, sewer, and other public utility facilities.

### "Municipality Official" means, for purposes of this policy:

- a) Any Municipality law enforcement officer.
- b) Any person providing security services in any Municipality Property pursuant to contract with the Municipality or with any person, firm, or corporation managing a Municipality Property on the Municipality's behalf.
- c) With respect to any building, facility, area, or space assigned to a Municipality department, division, or agency, the director or manager of such department, division, or agency, or any person that such official specifically designates in writing.
- d) The Municipality [Manager/Administrator], any Deputy Municipality [Manager/Administrator], [additional officers], or any person that such officials specifically designate in writing.

"Municipality Property" means any real property owned by the Municipality or in which the Municipality has a property interest or property management responsibility

"Public Area" means any area on Municipality Property that is generally open to general public access and occupancy that is not otherwise designated as a Limited Access Area.

"Rules of Conduct" means the specific guidelines set forth in this policy.

### Section 3: RULES OF CONDUCT ON MUNICIPALITY PROPERTY

To maintain an environment that promotes orderly administrative and business operations, and to take reasonable and prudent actions to protect the health, welfare, safety, and personal privacy of all persons at Municipality Property, the Rules of Conduct in this section apply and are to be enforced at all Municipality Property except where specific rules of conduct or prohibitions have been adopted for designated Municipality Property.

<u>Rules of Conduct Applicable to All Municipality Property</u>. The following Rules of Conduct shall apply at all Municipality Property, including both Public Areas and Limited Access Areas:

- a) No person shall enter, attempt to enter, or remain in any areas of Municipality Property for any purpose other than to conduct legitimate business with Municipality offices or tenants located at Municipality Property, to enjoy publicly accessible amenities in Public Areas, to lawfully assemble for social or public interaction in Public Areas specifically designated for such assembly, or to exercise other constitutionally protected rights. The appropriate Municipality Officials may adopt specific policies with respect to Municipality Property under their custody and control to manage conditions for use of such Municipality Property including without limitation to establish hours and terms of use, reservation protocols, use and user priority, and fees for use.
- b) No person shall engage in any activity on Municipality Property that would constitute a violation of federal, state, or local law or regulation.
- c) No person shall engage in activity that disrupts or interferes with the normal operation or administration of Municipality business at Municipality Property, lawful use by Municipality employees and authorized users at Municipality Property, or Municipality-permitted activities.
- d) No person shall stalk, harass, threaten, intimidate, or otherwise compromise the wellbeing and safety of Municipality employees or private third parties lawfully using Municipality Property. Photography, audio recording, or video recording does not, in and of itself, violate this Rule of Conduct. Likewise, conduct that would otherwise violate this Rule of Conduct shall not be permitted merely because the conduct involves photography, audio recording, or video recording.

- e) No person shall interfere or obstruct the free passage of Municipality employees or authorized third parties in or on Municipality Property, including without limitation by standing in, blocking access to, or occupying areas for purposes of photography, audio recording, or video recording.
- f) No person shall photograph, audio record, or video record in such a manner that would allow capture of, access to, or disclosure of private, personal, confidential, sensitive, or privileged information of private third parties. The Municipality may enforce this Rule of Conduct by imposing minimum standing or separation distances from areas, stations, desks, counters, or teller windows at which private third parties conduct business with Municipality employees.

### <u>Limited Access Areas</u> The following Rules of Conduct shall apply at all Limited Access Areas:

- a) Limited Access Areas shall be accessible only to the following: (i) employees, elected officials, and appointed officials of the Municipality; and (ii) private parties but only on a limited, as-needed, or by-invitation basis, to include those private parties accessing a Limited Access Area for the express purpose of conducting business with Municipality employees.
- b) Photography, audio recording, and video recording is prohibited in Limited Access Areas, except as follows: (i) any Municipality Official may authorize audio or video recording or photography in Limited Access Areas, for good cause shown, with the consent of all parties to be recorded or photographed, provided that any Municipality Official may impose appropriate and reasonable conditions on the recording or photography to prevent the unauthorized disclosure of confidential information; and (ii) audio and video recording and photography may be permitted in Limited Access Areas when specifically authorized by applicable law or agreements.
- c) No person shall photograph, audio record, or video record any private third party lawfully entering into, using, or occupying a Limited Access Area without the express consent of such third party.

### **Section 4: EXCLUSION**

If a person violates these Rules of Conduct while in or upon Municipality Property, any Municipality Official may eject and direct such person to leave Municipality Property for a period of up to 24 hours. It shall not be necessary for such Municipality Official to allege any crime or other violation of applicable law other than these Rules of Conduct in order to support such notice of exclusion; *provided* that violation of such notice of exclusion may be deemed a trespass under applicable law. The notice of exclusion shall be in writing, given to the person excluded and signed by the Municipality Official. It shall specify the dates and places of exclusion and shall contain a warning of consequences for failure to comply with the notice of exclusion.

### **Section 5: SECURITY PROCEDURES**

- a) Any person may photograph, film, or record audio of any Public Area. Any such activity should be reported to a Municipality Official, preferably a law enforcement officer if possible.
- b) Municipality employees should refrain from engaging with photographers and videographers wherever possible. Municipality employees should monitor photographers or videographers on Municipality Property, but should refrain from engaging them unless they violate any Rule of Conduct. In the event that engagement is necessary, every effort should be made to respond calmly without escalating the encounter.
- c) A Municipality employee who does not wish to be photographed or recorded may retire to a Limited Access Area.

- d) Municipality employees are not required to respond to questions or demands from any photographer or videographer, and should refrain from doing so if possible.
- e) Municipality employees may invite a private third party conducting business with the Municipality and who do not wish to be photographed or filmed to retire to a more private Limited Access Area in order to complete any business or transaction.
- f) Municipality law enforcement officers may approach photographers and videographers upon a complaint from a member of the public or Municipality employees that the activity is suspicious or based upon their own observation that the activity is suspicious or inconsistent with this Policy. This Policy neither limits nor expands the authority of Municipality law enforcement officers to initiate and pursue investigations, to perform pat downs or frisks based upon reasonable suspicion, or to conduct searches based upon probable cause in accordance with legal authority. Photography, audio recording, or video recording does not, in and of itself, rise to the level of reasonable suspicion or probable cause.

#### 2. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstances, shall be held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance to the extent it can be given effect, or the application of such provision to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby, and to this extent the provisions of this Ordinance are severable.

### 3. REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with any provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to the extent of such inconsistencies.

### TOWNSHIP OF HILLSIDE ORDINANCE 0-25-11

### CALENDAR YEAR 2025 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Council of the Township of Hillside in the County of Union finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2024 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Council hereby determines that a 3.5 % increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$ 1,488,972.97 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Council of the Township of Hillside, in the County of Union, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2025 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Hillside shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5 %, amounting to \$1,488,972.97, and that the CY 2025 municipal budget for the Township of Hillside be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

# ORDINANCE APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A FINANCIAL AGREEMENT WITH LIBERTY CROSSING URBAN RENEWAL, LLC FOR CERTAIN IMPROVEMENTS IN THE LIBERTY CROSSING REDEVELOPMENT AREA

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 *et seq*. (the "Redevelopment Law"), the Township of Hillside Council (the "Council") may direct the Planning Board to conduct an investigation and public hearing to recommend whether certain areas of the Township are in need of redevelopment pursuant to the procedures set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of the Redevelopment Law and by Resolution 23-142 adopted on April 25, 2023, the Council directed the Planning Board to conduct a preliminary investigation in order to investigate the real property located at 1350 Liberty Avenue, Hillside, NJ 07205 and 360 Hillside, NJ 07205 and designated on the Township Tax Maps as Block 604, Lots 25, 26 and 27, inclusive of any and all streets, "paper" streets, private drives and rights of ways (the "Study Area"), to determine if the Study Area should be determined to be an area in need of redevelopment, with the Township reserving the right to acquire property within the Study Area by condemnation; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Board retained Shamrock Enterprises, Ltd. ("Shamrock"), a professional planning firm to undertake such investigation and which prepared a report dated July 10, 2024, entitled *Redevelopment Study Report Concerning the Determination of the Proposed Block 604 – Lots 25, 26 & 27 Study Area As a "Condemnation Area in Need of Redevelopment"* (the "Study"), setting forth the findings and recommendations with respect to the redevelopment designation of the Study Area; and

WHEREAS, upon duly served and published notice pursuant to the Redevelopment Law, the Planning Board conducted a public hearing, via Zoom, on the Study on July 24, 2024 (the "Public Hearing"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Board, by Resolution #RED-2024-A adopted July 24, 2024, recommended that the Council designate only Lots 25 and 26 of the Study Area as a non-condemnation redevelopment area pursuant to the requirements of the Redevelopment Law; and

WHEREAS, the Council, by Resolution R-24-186 adopted on August 7, 2024, designated a portion of the Study Area, i.e. Block 604, Lots 25 and 26, as a non-condemnation area in need of redevelopment (the "Redevelopment Area") and authorized the preparation of a redevelopment plan for the Redevelopment Area; and

**WHEREAS,** by Ordinance O-24-19 duly adopted on December 18, 2024, the Council adopted the *Liberty Crossing Redevelopment Plan*, dated September 25, 2024, for the Redevelopment Area, which Plan was prepared by the Township's Planning Consultant Shamrock Enterprises, Ltd.; and

**WHEREAS,** Liberty Crossing Urban Renewal, LLC (the "Entity"), through an affiliated entity, is the owner of the Redevelopment Area (hereinafter, the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Entity proposes to finance, construct and implement on the Property a residential development that includes a senior center for public use. The Property currently consists of underutilized land with abandoned, dilapidated and obsolete structures. The project will redevelop, in phases, the Property with the construction of a combination of 183 market rate residential units and 40 market rate agerestricted residential units, to be occupied exclusively by persons 55 years of age or older (the "Project").

Accordingly, the Project will generate significant amount of new municipal revenue through the Annual Service Charge, improvement to the quality of life and creation of public benefits for existing and future residents of the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township has determined that the Entity possesses the proper qualifications and experience to implement and complete the Project in accordance with the Redevelopment Plan, and all other applicable laws, ordinances and regulations; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No,	adopted on February 25, 2025, the Township
authorized the execution of a redevelopment agreement with	n the Entity's affiliate, which shall reform as an
urban renewal entity or make assignment of the redevelop	oment agreement to the Entity as an affiliated
urban renewal entity to undertake the Project, which redeve	lopment agreement was executed on
, 2025 (the "Redevelopment Agreement");	and

**WHEREAS**, in order to ensure the financial feasibility of the Project, the Entity made application to the Township requesting a long-term tax exemption and financial agreement (the "<u>Application</u>") pursuant to the Long-Term Tax Exemption Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:20-1 <u>et seq.</u>, (the "<u>Exemption Law</u>"); and

WHEREAS, after review of the Application, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk and incorporated herein by reference, the Mayor recommended that the Application be approved; and

WHEREAS, the Township determined that the assistance provided to the Project pursuant to this Agreement will be a significant inducement for the Entity to proceed with the Project and that based on information set forth in the Application, the Project would not be feasible without such assistance; and

**WHEREAS**, in lieu of a separate Resolution, this Ordinance shall serve as the enactment in which the Township hereby approves the Entity's Application; and

**WHEREAS,** the parties have now negotiated a proposed form of financial agreement, a copy of which is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u>, and the Mayor and Council have determined that it is appropriate to approve the execution of the financial agreement substantially in the form attached hereto; and

**WHEREAS,** the Township Council makes the following findings with respect to the relative benefits of the Project to the redevelopment of the Property when compared to the costs, if any, associated with the tax exemption:

Relative benefits of the Project when compared to the costs include:

The financial agreement will benefit the Township and its inhabitants by furthering the redevelopment of the Redevelopment Area, which is an underutilized property that will add new residential offerings to the Township;

The combination of residential space, including the designation of age-restricted units, will serve the housing needs of the community and may spur other development and commercial activity in the surrounding area;

The proposed development will generate significant municipal revenues to the Township. It is not anticipated that there will be any extraordinary municipal costs associated with the Project. The Township's review and analysis indicates that the benefits of the Project outweigh any costs to the Township;

The project will attract new residents to the Project Area, which will contribute to the economic growth of existing local businesses and potentially to the creation of new businesses;

It is expected that the Project will create approximately 220 jobs during construction and 4-6 permanent jobs after construction; and

The relative stability and predictability of the service charges will allow the Entity to stabilize their expenses, which will insure the likelihood of the Project's success and ensure that it will have a positive impact on the surrounding area.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Township of Hillside, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey, that:

- 1. The findings set forth above are hereby adopted and made part of this Ordinance.
- 2. Pursuant to the authority granted under the Exemption Law, this Ordinance authorizes the long term tax exemption with respect to the Improvements of the Project on Block 604, Lots 25 and 26 on the official tax map of the Township of Hillside.
- 3. The Mayor is authorized to execute the financial agreement substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, and any other agreement or document related thereto deemed relevant and appropriate by counsel to the Township in furtherance of the financial agreement and this Ordinance.
- 4. The financial agreement herein authorized shall be subject to all requirements of the Exemption Law and all applicable federal, State and local laws and regulations.

### TOWNSHIP OF HILLSIDE ORDIANCANCE 0-24-07

### ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 78. POLICE DEPARTMENT SECTION 16 SCHOOL TRAFFIC GUARDS AND SPECIAL OFFICERS.

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Hillside desires to amend the current ordinance to provide for the appointment of Class Three Special Officers.

# NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HILLSIDE, UNION COUNTY, NEW JERSEY as follows:

1: CHAPTER 78: POLICE DEPARTMENT Section 16: School Traffic Guards and Special Officers is hereby *amended* as follows:

1. Appointment of School Traffic Guards and Special Officers-Class One.

A. The Township Council may appoint such number of school traffic guards and special officers as it may authorize, for a term not exceeding one year, and revoke such appointments without cause or hearing. Such school traffic guards and special officers shall carry out their duties and responsibilities under the direction and supervision of the Police Chief, and their powers, rights and duties shall be specifically defined by the Police Chief. The powers, rights and duties shall immediately cease at the expiration of the term for which they were appointed or upon revocation of their appointment. School traffic guards and special officers shall not carry revolvers or other weapons at any time except as otherwise directed by the Police Chief.

- B. No person shall be appointed a school traffic guard or special officer unless he is a citizen of the United States, is able to read, write and speak the English language, is physically qualified, is of good moral character, and shall not have been convicted of any crime. Reports shall be made by the Police Chief to the Township Committee concerning the eligibility and qualifications of any person proposed to be appointed a school traffic guard or special officer.
- C. All special officers appointed shall be designated Class One as per the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:14-146.11 and any special officers appointed pursuant to this subsection be limited to five appointees.
- 2. Appointment of Special Law Enforcement Officers-Class Three; Qualifications; Revocation.

A. Creation of position. In accordance with the provisions of P.L. 1986, c. 2, of the New Jersey Statutes, N.J.S.A. 40A:14-146.8 et seq., there is hereby created the position of special law enforcement officer Class Three for the Township of Hillside in the County of Union.

- **B.** Qualifications. In order to be eligible for appointment to the position of a Special Law Enforcement Officer Class Three, each applicant must:
  - (1) Be a resident of this state during the term of appointment;
  - (2) Be able to read, write and speak the English language well and intelligently and have a high school diploma or its equivalent;
  - (3) Be sound in body and of good health;

- (4) Be of good moral character;
- (5) Have not been convicted of any offense involving dishonesty or which would make him/her unfit to perform the duties of this position;
- (6) Have successfully undergone the same psychological testing that is required of all full-time police officers in this municipality;
- (7) Be a retired law enforcement officer who is less than 65 years of age; for the purposes of this subsection, a law enforcement officer shall not be considered retired if the officer's return to employment violates any federal or state law or regulation which would deem the officer's retirement as not being bona fide;
- (8) Have served as a duly qualified, fully trained, full-time officer in any municipality or county of this state or as a member of the State Police and was separated from that prior service in good standing:
- (9) Be physically capable of performing the functions of the position, determined in accordance with Police Training Commission guidelines;
- (10) Possess a New Jersey Police Training Commission basic police officer certification or New Jersey, State Police Academy certification;
- (11) Have completed the training course for safe schools resource officers developed pursuant to Subsection a of Section 2 of P.L. 2005. c. 276 (N.J.S.A. 52:17B-71.8).
- C. Classification; powers and duties. The classification of the special law enforcement officers shall be based upon the duties to be performed by said officers and are established as follows:
  - (1) Special law enforcement Class Three officers shall be authorized to exercise full powers and duties similar to those of a permanent, regularly appointed full-time police officer while providing security at a public school on the school premises during hours when the public school is normally in session or when it is occupied by public school students or their teachers. While on duty in the jurisdiction of employment, an officer may respond to offenses or emergencies off school grounds if they occur in the officer's presence while traveling to a school facility, but an officer shall not otherwise be dispatched or dedicated to any assignment off school property. The use of a firearm by an officer of this class shall be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Subsection b of Section 7 of P.L. 1985, c. 439 (N.J.S.A. 40A:14-146.14). An officer of this class shall not be authorized to carry a firearm while off duty unless the officer complies with the requirements set forth in Subsection 1 of N.J.S.A. 2C:39-6 authorizing a retired law enforcement officer to carry a firearm.
  - (2) A special law enforcement Class Three officer shall be employed only to assist the Police Department with security duties at public schools and shall not supplant a law enforcement officer employed pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:17-43 or a safe schools resource officer employed pursuant to the provisions of Section 3 of P.L. 2005, c. 276 (N.J.S.A. 18A:17-43.1).
  - (3) A special law enforcement Class Three officer appointed pursuant to the provisions of P.L. 1985, c. 439 (N.J.S.A. 40A:14-146.8 et seq.) shall not, based on this appointment, be eligible for health care benefits or enrollment in any state-administered retirement system.

- (4) Payment shall be based on an hourly rate.
- **D.** Compliance with legislation of the Police Department. All duly appointed special law enforcement officers Class Three shall be subject to the rules and regulations governing the Police Department of the Township of Hillside.

### **E.** Supervision and direction.

- (1) A special law enforcement officer Class Three shall be under the supervision and direction of the Chief of Police or his designee and shall perform his/her duties only in the Township of Hillside, unless in fresh pursuit of any person pursuant to Chapter 195 of Title 2A of the New Jersey Statutes.
- (2) The special law enforcement Class Three officer shall comply with the rules and regulations applicable to the conduct and decorum of the permanent, regularly appointed police officers of the Police Department.
- **F.** Training. No special law enforcement officer Class Three shall commence his/her duties until he/she has completed the training as required under N.J.S.A. 40A:14-146.11, as amended from time to time.
- G. Uniforms. The uniform of special law enforcement officer Class Three shall be determined by the Chief of Police and shall be in compliance with N.J.S.A. 40A:14-146.12.

### 2. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstances, shall be held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance to the extent it can be given effect, or the application of such provision to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby, and to this extent the provisions of this Ordinance are severable.

### 3. REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with any provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to the extent of such inconsistencies.

#### 4. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect 20 days following the final adoption thereof by the Township Council of the Township of Hillside and shall be published as required by law.

#### TOWNSHIP OF HILLSIDE ORDINANCE 0-25-08

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LOCAL UNIT'S ALLOCABLE SHARE OF CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE JOINT MEETING OF ESSEX AND UNION COUNTIES, BY AND IN THE TOWNSHIP OF HILLSIDE, IN THE COUNTY OF UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (THE "LOCAL UNIT"); APPROPRIATING \$1,160,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,160,000 BONDS OR NOTES TO FINANCE THE COST THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HILLSIDE, IN THE COUNTY OF UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Joint Meeting of Essex and Union Counties (the "Joint Meeting") on behalf of the Township of Hillside, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey (the "Local Unit") as general improvements. For the said improvements stated in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the aggregate sum of \$1,160,000. Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c) of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq., as amended and supplemented (the "Local Bond Law"), no down payment is required as this bond ordinance authorizes obligations for environmental infrastructure projects which are funded by a loan from the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (the "I-Bank").

SECTION 2. For the financing of said improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof and to meet the \$1,160,000 appropriation, negotiable bonds of the Local Unit are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,160,000 pursuant to, and within all limitations prescribed by, the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable notes of the Local Unit in a principal amount not exceeding \$1,160,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to, and within the limitations prescribed by, said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 3. The improvements hereby authorized and purposes for the financing of which said debt obligations are to be issued are for the Local Unit's allocable share of the 2025 capital improvement projects being undertaken by the Joint Meeting, including, but not limited to, (i) the

replacement of the Digester #3 Cover consisting of, but not limited to, the replacement of the steel floating, gas-holding digester tank cover, the replacement of internal piping including sludge inlet, sludge withdrawal and digester gas withdrawal piping and associated pipe supports, and the rehabilitation of sludge and digester gas piping and associated Digester #3 equipment in the Digester Building; (ii) upgrades to Primary Settling Tank #4 consisting of, but not limited to, the replacement of the traveling bridge, cross collector, and associated equipment in Primary Settling Tank #4; and (iii) the construction of six (6) platforms in the Co-Generation Facility to allow for safe access for personnel to perform regular maintenance on the Co-Generation engines.

- a. All improvements shall include, as applicable, all work, materials, equipment, engineering, design, architectural, environmental consulting work, preparation of plans and specifications, permits, bid documents, conducting and preparation of reports and studies, equipment rental, labor and appurtenances necessary therefore or incidental thereto.
- b. The aggregate estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said improvements or purposes is \$1,160,000.
- c. The aggregate estimated cost of said improvements or purposes is \$1,160,000.

SECTION 4. In the event the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, and/or the County of Union make a loan, contribution or grant-in-aid to the Local Unit for the improvements authorized hereby and the same shall be received by the Local Unit prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then the amount of such bonds or notes to be issued shall be reduced by the amount so received from the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, and/or the County of Union. In the event, however, that any amount so loaned, contributed or granted by the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, and/or the County of Union shall be received by the Local Unit after the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then such funds shall be applied to the payment of the bonds or notes so issued and shall be used for no other purpose. This Section 4 shall not apply, however, with respect to any contribution or grant in aid received by the Local Unit as a result of using such funds from this bond ordinance as "matching local funds" to receive such contribution or grant

in aid.

SECTION 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer of the Local Unit, provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date, unless such bond anticipation notes are permitted to mature at such later date in accordance with the provisions of the New Jersey Infrastructure Trust Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11B-1 ("NJIT Act"). The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer of the Local Unit shall determine all matters in connection with the bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time in accordance with the provisions of Section 8.1 of the Local Bond Law and, as applicable, the provisions of the NJIT Act. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price and accrued interest thereon from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, the description, the interest rate, and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes so sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The Local Unit hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Local Unit is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

SECTION 7. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- a. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and are improvements which the Local Unit may lawfully undertake as general capital improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- b. The average period of usefulness of said improvements, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 30 years, which is within the limitations of said Local Bond Law.
- c. The supplemental debt statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Local Unit and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Local Unit, as defined in the Local Bond Law, is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$1,160,000 and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
- d. An aggregate amount not exceeding \$271,983 for items of expense listed in and permitted under section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the improvements hereinbefore described.
- e. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40:63-134, bonds authorized and issued by the Local Unit to finance improvements or works for the Joint Meeting shall not be taken to be included within or governed by any limitation fixed by law to the amount of bonds authorized to be issued by the Local Unit.
- SECTION 8. The full faith and credit of the Local Unit are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the debt obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The debt obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Local Unit, and the Local Unit shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Local Unit for the payment of the debt obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.
  - SECTION 9. The Local Unit reasonably expects to reimburse any expenditures toward

the costs of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof and paid prior to the issuance of any bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance with the proceeds of such bonds or notes.
